A walk along Portsmouth's impressive waterfront is a real journey into the city's past. Join a guided walk to gain an expert's view, book a free Greeter for an insider's view or self-guide yourselves along the Millennium Promenade, taking in the Camber Dock, including the new home base of Land Rover Ben Ainslie Racing, Round Tower and Square Tower.

Continue along the seafront to find the green space of Southsea Common, impressive gardens and a range of activities both on land and on the water . Attractions include the D-Day Museum - relating the story of the Normandy landings, Southsea Castle - built by Henry VIII and the Royal Marines Museum.

For literary fans, Portsmouth is a surprising destination. Charles Dickens was born here and his birth place was preserved as a fascinating museum. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle created his famous character Sherlock Holmes whilst residing in Portsmouth and the city is now home to a large collection of Conan Doyle memorabilia, on display as 'A Study in Sherlock' exhibition at the Portsmouth Museum.





Visit Portsmouth



Two major new developments will transform the visitor experience at Portsmouth Historic Dockyard as two of its iconic attractions, HMS Victory and the Mary Rose undergo major makeovers.

Easter 2016 will see the biggest change to the way that the world's most celebrated warship, HMS Victory, is presented to the public. A major reinterpretation of its visitor route through the ship will enable visitors to follow in the footsteps of Nelson, its most famous Admiral, as the ship embarks on its defining voyage to Cape Trafalgar. It concludes with the aftermath of the ferocious Battle of Trafalgar which saw Nelson mortally wounded and the crew mourning their great leader.

The Mary Rose's long and remarkable history will enter an exciting new phase as the wall which has previously separated visitors from the ship will be replaced with glazing, providing remarkable unrestricted views of the ship. Removing the walls will open up spectacular views of the hull where the visitor will be able to experience the full magnitude of the Mary Rose for the first time since she was raised from the Solent in 1982. Over one million people have already visited the new museum since its opening in 2013 and this will be a sensational reason to return.
