## **Robert Rauschenberg**

Tate Modern, 1 December 2016 – 2 April 2017

Organised in collaboration with New York's MoMA and in close dialogue with the Robert Rauschenberg Foundation, this exhibition will be the first posthumous, retrospective survey of this US artist's work since 1997. Each chapter of his career will be represented by major works, including rare loans and graphic screen prints. A selection of his 'Combines', the famous collection that presents a hybrid between painting, sculpture, and graphic screenprints will also be on display.
