Welcome to the Forest

Waltham Forest, 11 – 13 January 2019

Mercury Award-winning local hero Talvin Singh will lead a stellar cast of artists in a unique collaboration with Waltham Forest's young people for a massive opening event, *Welcome to the Forest,* to celebrate the start of Waltham Forest's tenure as London's first Borough of Culture (with events running throughout the year).
